Director's Report February 2014

General

The mild winter conditions continued throughout February, this has accelerated the development of eggs in the hatchery at Contin. High flows have restricted opportunities to stock eggs out until a dry spell in the last week of the month. Bailiffs have been working hard to get eggs out for our stocking programme and for two Glasgow University research projects before they get too close to hatching.

Carcass tags have been ordered for this year's carcass tagging and will be distributed to anglers when angling clubs supply their membership lists.

Scottish Government has commissioned a wide reaching review of fishery management in Scotland. With the agreement of the Management Committee I am to sit on the Technical Working Group for this review. The first meeting will take place in March and details of the review process can be found at;
